Food Challenge




Today we are making British Scones

You will need:

225g self-raising flour
1 tsp baking powder
25g sugar
50g butter
150ml milk

- 1. Sift the flour, baking powder and sugar into a large bowl. Then add the butter and rub together so it looks like breadcrumbs.**
- 2. Add the milk slowly, mixing it into a firm dough.**
- 3. Roll onto a floury work surface until it is about 4cm thick. Use cutters or a cup turned upside down to cut circle scones and put the scones on a greased baking tray.**
- 4. Cook for 15 minutes in a 200-degree oven until they are golden brown.**
- 5. Eat with butter, jam or cream!**

Amen.


Let's make

- 1. You will need a copy of the Union Flag on the back page.**
- 2. Colour the flag in blue and red.**
- 3. Once you have finished decorating your flag, find a long straight stick or twig.**
- 4. Use some strong tape to fasten the flag securely onto the top of the stick.**
- 5. Now you are ready to wave your flag in great celebration!**
