So here are some more environmental tips for you to consider:

BIODEGRADABLE HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTS

While you cannot control whether or not the products you dispose of will end up being recycled and reused, you can purchase products made of non-synthetic ingredients that are biodegradable to limit the impact of this waste.

Biodegradable products dissolve due to contact with bacteria and fungi. This means that if they come into contact with nature, they won't cause any environmental harm, as they disappear through natural processes.

These products might include:

- Recycled toilet paper
- Natural ingredient shampoo
- Natural deodorant
- Bamboo toothbrush
- Washcloths made from hemo or agave fibres

As the weather starts to cool, consider warming yourself up with a tasty casserole. They can be economical, using cheaper cuts of meat and making use at this time of year with the abundance of home-grown vegetables available.

Somerset Pork

Ingredients:

- 4 boneless pork chops, approx 600g in total (alternatively use tenderloin or shoulder cut into chunks)
- 25g butter
- 1 medium onion sliced
- 25g flour
- 150ml cider or apple juice
- 100ml vegetable stock
- 2 granny smith apples cored and sliced
- 1 garlic clove
- Pinch of fresh or dried sage
- Salt and freshly ground pepper
- 30 ml fresh single cream (optional)

Method:

- 1. Fry the pork in butter with onion.
- 2. When brown remove meat and onions from pan and place in a shallow ovenproof dish.
- 3. Add flour to the pan and cook gently until brown.
- 4. Stir in cider, stock, garlic, seasoning, sage and apples.
- When apples begin to soften pour sauce over pork.
- 6. Cover and bake at 190C Gas mark 5 for 30-40 mins.
- Pour cream over and serve immediately with mashed potatoes and green vegetables.

Beef Casserole with Herby Dumplings

Ingredients:

- 1 tbs oil for frying
- 600g lean braising steak (fat removed)
- 1 litre beef stock
- 1 large onion finely chopped
- 1 garlic clove crushed
- 2 celery sticks finely chopped
- 3 carrots, 1 finely chopped, 2 cut into chunks
- 1 tbsp tomato puree
- 1 tbs balsamic vinegar
- 1 parsnip chopped
- 300g butternut squash thinly sliced

For the Dumplings:

- 150g self-raising flour
- Salt and freshly ground pepper
- 2 tbs chopped parsley or thyme
- 1 egg yolk lightly beaten
- I 1 tsp olive oil

Method:

- 1. Preheat oven to 180C/160C fan Gas mark 4
- Heat oil in a pan, add beef in batches and cook until brown, add more oil if needed. Transfer beef to a warmed ovenproof dish and set aside.
- Add onion to pan and cook until softened.
 Add garlic and cook for 2 mins. Add celery and finely chopped carrot and cook for 3 mins. Stir in tomato puree and vinegar and cook for a further 3 mins. Return the meat to the pan and stir in the rest of the stock and bring to the boil.
- 4. Transfer to the ovenproof dish and cook in oven without a lid for 1 hour.
- Add the parsnip, squash and carrot chunks, put a lid on the dish and cook for a further 30 mins.
- 6. For the dumplings, put the flour in a bowl with salt and pepper, herbs and mix together. Add the egg and oil and add just enough cold water to bring dough together. Be careful not to add too much water as it will make the dumplings heavy. Knead the mixture a little.
- 7. Shape into eight balls and put on top of the casserole, pushing down a little to coat in the juices. Cover with lid and return to the oven for 15 mins. Remove lid and cook for a further 15 mins.
- 8. Serve immediately alongside some green vegetables and warm crusty bread.

LORD, TEACH US HOW TO PRAY

When to Pray in Church

Prayer is spiritual communication between man and God, a two-way conversation, to talk but also to listen. It is natural to ask for things we need, to share what maybe troubling us or our loved ones, or help on a decision to be made.

It can be difficult to know when and how to pray whilst visiting a Church or attending a service. Going into church can be compared with visits you may make either to friends or social events. When you arrive, you greet each other and say hello.

Sometimes with the hustle and bustle of a lively Church we forget that God is our host. We are visiting Him in his home and neglect to share a few words with Him. There are three times during the Eucharist when we should give a little time to say a few words to our host.

When we enter Church, we are entering God's House and as such, we should greet our host



as we would in a friend's home, by sitting for a moment in prayer, to say hello to God and to prepare ourselves for worship. If we have shared a meal together, we would thank our host for providing us with food and refreshments. Before leaving we would say thank you for the time we have spent together.

Prayer when entering Church

A Prayer when visiting a church might focus on preparing for worship, asking for guidance and seeking God's presence. Elements could include: Thankfulness, Guidance, Focus, Intercession, Humility or a special request.

A simple prayer to use before a service:

"Heavenly Father, thank you for this opportunity to gather and worship you. Please help me to focus my heart and mind on you today, to put aside distractions and to encounter your presence. Guide us through the service and speak to us through your Word. In Jesus' name, Amen."

Prayer after Communion

Holy Communion is also known as the Lord' Supper or the Eucharist. It commemorates the Last Supper of Jesus Christ with his disciples. Jesus shared bread and wine with his followers, telling them it represented his body and blood, and instructed them to do the same in remembrance of Him. Christians celebrate Holy Communion by sharing bread and wine as a symbolic act of remembrance and worship, reflecting on Jesus' sacrifice and teachings.

A simple prayer after taking Communion or a Blessing:

"Thank you, Lord, for the gift of this sacrament. May it strengthen me in faith and love, and help me to live out your will, Amen"

Prayer before leaving Church

If you have shared time with others, it would be expected that you say your farewells before parting. Before leaving church, you may like to sit for a moment before you leave and offer a prayer of thanks for all that you have seen or heard during your time in God's House.

A simple prayer before leaving Church:

"Lord thank you for this time of worship and fellowship. As we leave this place, guide us in our daily lives and help us to be a light to others, Amen"

Prayer at St. Michael's is the bedrock of our Christian community and church family. It is also the bedrock of a Christian life. Therefore, the clergy and Lay Reader are available for guidance and advice on the many different forms of prayer both at home, and during church services. As Christians we never stop learning about prayer as we deepen our relationship with God.

To get started there are 4 simple ways that you can be involved:

1) Prayer Cards

Please do take the FREE prayer cards at the back of the church. There is a range of cards for different circumstances in life.

2) New Prayer Cards for Young People

FREE specific prayer cards for our young people. There is a range of cards for different circumstances in life.

3) Prayer Board

Please do use the board to add your own particular requests and also light a votive candle.

4) Prayer Requests

If you wish to have the name of a loved one on the weekly prayer list please see Rev. Alison. It may be for illness, circumstance or perhaps for the soul of the person who has recently died and their family.

I moved to Pelsall three years ago from Birmingham to be closer to my family.

Having lived for the past thirty years in a built-up area of the city, it was a nice change for me to move to Pelsall Village, which still retained it's old charm and is surrounded by some beautiful countryside.

A Tribute to Doreen Bethell





'My souls magnifies the Lord: My spirit rejoices in God my Saviour. For he has looked upon his handmaid's lowliness: behold, from now on will all ages call me blessed.'

On 17th July 2025 our beloved friend and member of St. Michael's and All Angels Church congregation passed away at the age of 88. Doreen had faithfully served at Christ Church, Blakenall Heath and at Pelsall parish since 2002. She had served under the leadership of many incumbents throughout the years. And yet it fell upon me to have the privilege and responsibility to take the Requiem Mass of this dear Christian soul and to now write a tribute for this Blakenall lady born on 26th September 1936 to Alfred and Grace Smith.

Throughout her life Doreeen was a devoted Christian and dedicated disciple. Her Christian faith shone through and it strengthened her and others. It meant that she was a 'rock' to her family of which she was immensely proud. This family grew from her marriage of over 55 years with Tom who she married on 7th March in 1955. Eventually they made their family home in Smithfield Road with Yvonne and Peter and with the birth of their own child Stephen, followed with Grandchildren Emma and Victoria and Grandchildren too. Doreen was a family person showing love, support and care for them all.

Yet if there was one biblical quote that epitomises the life of Doreen. It is a quote from the Magnificant. Her life, like the Magnificat, known as Mary's Song is a testament to God's faithfulness and the promise of eternal life. This also expresses Doreen's deep faith and trust in God's mercy. Like Mary, Doreen found joy in God's favour, even when facing challenges such as the death of her husband, Tom or her chronic chest condition. Doreens spirituality, her approach to life, her sense of the important things, was bound up with her devotion to the Lord and her discipleship. . She believed that nothing could separate her from the love of God through her life. Until the day she died she was still an

active member of our church As the Branch Leader of the MU since 2012 her leadership was dedicated to the MU principles of supporting families and children as laid down by founder Mary Sumner. So she with Chris Miller was key in establishing the 'Marv's Samaritans'. Her presence in the singing group,



reading at worship, leading intercessions, Open the Book team member and PCC membership reflected her wider involvement in church life. Doreen would always be at the MU cake stall at the Christmas Market. She was always there bearing witness to the God who she worshipped weekly in Church at Morning Prayer, or Holy Communion on Sundays and Wednesdays. Using her many gifts and talents associated with knitting, singing, serving, praying, she made friends across the ecumenical community in Pelsall.

But poignantly Doreen was always ready and waiting for the next call on her talents and resources; but most of all, day in, day out, ready to worship through song, prayer, friendship, hospitality and praising into which Doreen poured her heart and soul. Her daily discipleship and her daily sacrifice of praise was her readiness for all that might befall her. Her heart was always ready to give praise, to serve and to express her faith and help others express theirs. Her many qualities of life such as her pastoral care, compassion and generosity of spirit meant she had a good heart for people. Doreen was helpful, generous and always thoughtful. She was a lady who was determined with high expectations and standards with a goal in sight.

For me and others it has been an absolute pleasure to know Doreen since childhood. Our lives have certainly been enriched by her Christian presence amongst us and her positive contribution towards not only our church but also that of Blakenall Heath. We find comfort in knowing that Doreen is now at peace with Tom, resting in God's loving embrace. May we all be inspired by her example of faithullness and steadfast love.

So let us say 'thank her' for her devotion and her diligence over all these years. As the Shakesperian character Hamlet said 'May flights of Angels sing thee to thy rest.' Well done, good and faithful servant!
